In this century, great use has been made of oil and natural gas, and in the last more than 25 years, the use of atomic reactors has provided another source of energy. But none of these fuels (except wood) is renewable. When they have been used, they cannot be replaced. All of them, moreover, produce pollution of different kinds and magnitudes, and many people are concerned about the safety of the reactors.
