- 1. One of the greatest mysteries of birds' life is migration or travelling. Every year during autumn and early winter birds travel from their breeding places in the other regions of Asia, Europe and America to the warmer southern lands. They make their return journey again during spring and early summer.
- 2. They are very punctual too unless they are delayed because of bad weather. Birds usually travel in flocks. The V-shaped formation of cranes and geese attracts much attention as they speed across the sky. Usually the male birds go first to their breeding grounds and the female birds follow in a few days.
- 3. The movement of birds with the changing seasons was known from the earliest times, but people had strange ideas as to why the birds travelled or where they went. To explain their absence, they said that the birds buried themselves in the mud and slept there throughout the winter.
- 4. Later, detailed studies of migration were undertaken. Information was gained by directly observing the habits of birds and also by ringing. Ringing is done by capturing a bird and putting on its leg a light band of metal or plastic. The band has a number, date, identification mark and the address to which the finder is requested to return the ring.
- 5. The bird is then set free. The place where such a bird is shot, captured or found dead gives a clue to the direction and locality to which the bird has migrated. Birds migrate primarily to escape the bitter cold and limited food supply.
- 6. The migration of birds is a fascinating study indeed, and there are still many unsolved mysteries. For example, how do birds know when to start? How do they know the way over the sea without any landmark? How do they manage to return year after year to the same locality? These and many more interesting questions are waiting for you to solve.
