A literature review is an account of the information that has been published on a particular topic by renowned scholars and researchers. A well written literature review can provide a mental road map of the past, present and future of research in a particular field. A few reviews of past studies and works on the subject of study in hand are given in this chapter. They are expected to serve useful background materials for the present study. In this chapter researcher has gone through many articles and take a literature review as per the following facets.

- Background of Subject Guide
- Subject Guide: Importance and use
- Various Forms and contents of subject guide
- Creation of Subject Guide
- Role Of Subject Librarian

2.1 Background of Subject Guide

Bruce, H. and Clayton, P. (1999) have explained the role of Internet in academic libraries in the article "An Internet role for the academic Librarian". This article also examined the relationship between training and satisfaction of the users with information seeking on the Internet. The academic librarian is a key stakeholder in the development of Internet technologies. The profession is well positioned to promote and exploit the benefits of information networks. The outcomes of this article suggest that academic librarians might consider shifting their emphasis from Internet training to network-based support for self-learning. The academic library community has

taken a keen interest in Internet awareness and training. This article examines the view that training might increase the satisfaction that users derive from information seeking on the Internet. Academics to use the Internet to solve problems associated with roles like research, teaching and writing. Because they rely so much on self instruction themselves, training sessions offered by academic librarians should focus on developing background knowledge that will form the basis for independent learning in the contexts of use which match these academic roles.

In the article written by Hemming, W. (2005), "Online pathfinders: Toward an experience centered model" a focus has been placed on the history of library pathfinders and it shows that the main aim of the pathfinder is to teach users how to use library resources effectively. The article also gives a step by step instructional tools approach to Library Pathfinders. The Author has discussed a major issue among proponents of user-centered services have been the framing of bibliographic instruction; long addressed as the adaptation of the user to the system, it has been extremely difficult to reframe bibliographic instruction as the adaptation of the system to the user, the only apparent alternative. Perhaps a closer look in this context will help demonstrate how the model developed here to respond to this issue by suggesting instead an experience centered approach to bibliographic instruction. It is hoped that the model might contribute to filling a gap in library instructional theory and facilitate the design of services that will make the user's experience of the library a more transparent one, which was, after all, the original purpose of the subject research guide.

2.2 Subject Guide: Importance and use

The importance of library pathfinder has been explained in the article "Pathfinders: A new possibility for co-operative reference service," has been given by Stevens, C. H., Canfield, M. P and Gardner, J. J. (1973). The authors describe pathfinders in detail along with its formats and contents. It also indicates how this reference sources and reference aids can provide improved user services. Authors also say that pathfinders will be compiled for users in all types of libraries to satisfy their information needs. Library pathfinders designed to help researchers to locate the information resources.

While stating the importance of subject bibliography Olson, L. E. and Koskiala, S. (1982) in their article "The human dimension to subject Bibliography" as a link in the chain of communication of information between its producers and its users have explained subject bibliography as a record of publication in specific areas of knowledge. The purpose of this presentation is to suggest a possible focus for teaching subject bibliography. Authors have described the librarian as a collector and bibliographic instructor.

Magi, T. J. (2003) in her article titled "What's best for students? Comparing the effectiveness of a traditional print pathfinder and a web-based research tool" tested the effectiveness of traditional print pathfinders along with the web based pathfinders. The study demonstrated that librarians should not assume students will prefer and use only web based research aids. In this study, author finds that students prefer the traditional print library pathfinders. The author suggested that print library pathfinders should be distributed to the library patrons. The traditional print pathfinder has received higher ratings on use, ease of use, and helpfulness, but both tools resulted in students citing a similar number of recommended sources. In spite of the students' high level of confidence and experience with computers and the web, they rated the traditional print pathfinder easier to use and more helpful than the web-based finding tool and they gave it greater use.

Kuntz, K. (2003) states the usefulness of pathfinders in the article," Pathfinders helping students find paths to information". The author describes pathfinders as pathways on the information highway. They support students/patrons and library staff to design a plan of action and a place to start. A pathfinder is literally a map for locating important information destinations with street signs and helpful hints along the way. It is up to the user to actually follow the route in order to arrive successful. A pathfinder is a path guiding route for students as they navigate the complex world of the information age. The pathfinder is considered as a starting point, a launching pad for students. A pathfinder is powerful because it highlights a variety of resources. Instead of simply listing nonfiction books on Native American life, a Pathfinder may also include fiction, poetry, cooking, or folklore. It can also feature topical periodicals such as Faces, American History, or Zoo books. Through the section entitled keywords and phrases for searching, a pathfinder addresses another common problem for researchers who sometimes have difficulty in selecting the right keywords. For

example, when looking for birds, try "specific birds, such as eagles" or "types of birds, such as birds of prey." Again, the purpose is to guide the student down a useful path, modeling effective search strategies.

In the article titled "Students, Librarians and Subject Guides: Improving a poor rate of return" the authors Reeb, B. and Gibbons, S. (2004) focused on the main purpose of Subject Guide which is introduced to the students as the reference materials in a particular discipline. The authors conducted various surveys and usability test and suggest librarian community to move away from the traditional use of discipline based to more course based devices for organizing library resources. Librarians use subject guides to introduce students to library materials. Surveys, usability tests, and usage statistics demonstrate that students do not relate well to subject guides. This research article suggest that library resources organized or delivered at a course level are more in line with how undergraduate students approach library research. Author says that as librarians, we influence student learning in many ways during our workday. This happens in a reference interview and may last only a few minutes. Sometimes by choice or by necessity, a face-to-face encounter between student and librarian is not possible. The library's website or print publications distributed at the reference desk can extend librarians' educational role, if these tools meet the students on their terms and in context.

Another survey conducted by Mi, J. And Nesta, F. (2006) in their article titled, "Marketing library services to the NET generation" suggests the librarians to adopt Marketing policy for popularizing the library services. The new generation called as Net generation has negative views towards the libraries. They prefer to search information on Google rather than in libraries. Effect of their Net-saviness, libraries Subject Guides are used very rarely. It shows the new methods and ways to be adopted by the libraries to serve their users in the form of e-mail services, electronic document delivery services, RSS feeds, subject portals, Electronic Subject Guides as a Marketing strategy. The paper finds that libraries can apply classic marketing principles to attract and better serve new generations of users. Although libraries no longer have a monopoly on information sources, libraries do offer value-added services.

Strutin, M. (2008) conducted a study titled "Making Research Guides more useful and better used" which gives information on how to make research guides more useful. A survey was conducted for the students regarding the use of research guides from the Santa Clara University library. The study revealed that students' goals towards the Subject Guides are concerned with speed and simplicity. The author describes how to maintain the usefulness of Subject Guide with some points – Easy to use, Easy to create and maintain related to a specific course, lying on the course website and lastly how it can be used in information Literacy programmes.

The article, "Library use of web based research Guide" by Ghaphery, J. And Erin W.E. (2012) describes the use of web based research guides in Libraries. For preparing a LibGuides content management system has been used in libraries. This article presents record of quantitative adoption of LibGuides through survey. This paper describes the ways in which libraries are currently implementing and managing web-based research guides by examining two sets of data. One set of data was compiled by visiting the websites of ninety-nine American university ARL libraries and recording the characteristics of each site's research guide. The other set of data is based on an online survey of librarians about the ways in which their libraries implement and maintain research guides. In conclusion, a discussion follows that includes implications for the library technology community.

Wakeham, M., et. Al. (2012) collectively wrote a article, "Library Subject Guides: A case study of evidence- informed Library development" in which they studied the value of Subject Guides to its users. They have conducted a survey and with the help of case study encouraged some new ways to make Subject Guides more useful to users. This paper describes the process whereby a University library investigated the value of its subject guides to its users. A literature review and surveys of library staff, library users and other libraries were carried out. Existing library subject guides and those of other higher education libraries were evaluated. The project team reported regularly to the wider library team throughout the yearlong investigation and made recommendations. The project served to develop the professional skills of the project team, to expand the knowledge of the wider library team and encouraged new ways of thinking about provision of guides to users.

2.3 Various forms and contents of subject guide

Jung, C. R. et. al. (1987) wrote a research article titled, "Pathfinders: An intellectual guide to libraries". The author took a reference of Calvin college library at Castlon State College. With the help of experience author describes contents and forms of pathfinders. Author also states the benefits of pathfinders from the views of library users and library staff. Collection of 38 pathfinders and bibliographies was developed by the reference staff of the Calvin College Library at Castleton State College, Vermont. Designed to present the types of literature available in particular subject fields and those works readily available in the College Library, typical pathfinders include a cover page explaining the use of the card catalog and periodicals, and sections on research guides and bibliographies; dictionaries, encyclopedias, and handbooks; and indexes and abstracts. Each entry provides the author, title, call number and a brief description of the reference tool. The pathfinders are as follows: American History, Art and Architecture, Biology, Business and Industry, Careers, etc.

The concept library pathfinders along with a few definitions have been given by Dahl, C. (2001) in the article titled, "Electronic Pathfinders in Academic Libraries: An Analysis of their content and form". The paper also explains how electronic pathfinders are different from the traditional sources along with its idea about the contents and forms. It includes analysis of 45 electronic pathfinders according to the consistency, scope, readability and usability. The content and the format of the chosen pathfinders were assessed in terms of consistency and scope. Also considered were overall readability and whether they were effectively constructed to be used as starting points for further research. The analysis revealed that the guidelines were not uniformly followed, leaving some pathfinders more complex and less useful than others. Further, it demonstrated that specific guidelines must be created for electronic pathfinders because they pose particular problems that are not addressed in the current literature about pathfinders in general.

Detailed information about gateways and portals has been given by Halm, J. V. (2002) in the article, "Information Gateways". They have explained gateways and portals as impressive and progressive solutions to access local and global information sources. It is found that Gateways and portals are new and latest forms of Subject Guides. As per the author's opinion there is a need for an integrated approach to the

design and implementation of library automation, digital library, digitization projects. It is the author's view that considerable effects may be expected from a merger of these three activities within one entity at a time when integral skills are increasingly being required.

The importance of online teaching and instructions can be seen in the article written by Yi H. (2005), "Library instructions go online: An Inevitable trend". In the present internet era academic libraries are transforming rapidly to meet the changing user needs and they have to face many challenges. Imparting library instructions are a part of the information literacy program which includes instructions to users on how to use library and library resources effectively through internet and web 2.0 applications. This article concludes with a focus on online connections, online references and online instructions. The momentum towards "cyber-delivery" is inevitable and is driven by a variety of factors, which can be understood as either external or intrinsic to the arena of Information Literacy. External factors include the pressure to find the most effective educational approaches to train students to use tools such as Google appropriately, intrinsic factors include the innate suitability of online Information literacy for encouraging independent learning and student-centered education.

A new approach in the direction of user expectations in terms of services provided by libraries can be seen in the article, "Promoting library services in a Google world" by Schmidt, J. (2007). For this purpose new products are being developed in the form of video clips, online galleries and Subject Guides. These subject guides are in the form of library products which are useful to promote, advertise and market the library services. The paper finds that libraries no longer operate in a "come and get it" environment and new ways of outreach are described which ensure that librarians are creating an awareness of the services available and ensuring effective use of resources through a variety of approaches used in University libraries in Australia and at McGill University in Montreal, Canada.

Sinkinson, C. et. al. (2012) in their article, "Guiding design: Exposing Librarian and student Mental Models of research Guides" have given instructions about how to design pathfinders with the help of comparative study of user and designer choices. They have also discussed about user needs, habits of patrons from which librarian enables to create useful research guides. The study identifies user group preferences

for the organization and content of research guides, as well as themes emerging from the collected study data that contrast librarian and user mental models. Interested librarians will gain insights into student perceptions and use of research guides in academic libraries today as well as recommendations for guide design.

2.4 Creation Of Subject Guide

Dupuis, J., Ryan, P. And Steeves, M. (2007) has collectively shared this experience in their article, "Creating dynamic Subject Guides". A difference between two terms Subject Guides and Subject Pathfinders has been explained. They also stated that Subject guides have replaced the previous method of creating static HTML subject Pathfinders. Enhancements that are being discussed for the future include having a wider hierarchy of subjects to give users the ability to go from the relatively small set of broad subjects, already defined, down to narrower subjects. Another useful addition would be to enable linking between library catalogue records and the subject guides so that records for print resources could be included without having to enter them manually.

For creating Subject Guides some solutions are available in the market which is given by Moses, D. and Richard, J. (2008) in their paper, "Solutions for Subject Guides." In this paper the Acadia University created SubjectGuide by using LibGuides in 2009, a subscription based software, while Holland College used Subject Plus, open source software. The software's, their application, merits and demerits are discussed in detail. This article describes two libraries' experiences with the implementation of new software packages to deliver timely, accurate and dynamic content via library subject guides. Acadia University in Wolfville, Nova Scotia implemented new subject guides using LibGuides in 2007 and Holland College in Charlottetown.

Similar study was conducted by Carrado, E. M. (2008) in his study titled, "Delicious Subject Guides: Maintaining Subject Guides using a social bookmarking site" states that by using web 2.0, social bookmarking sites the subject guides can be easily managed. The author discusses many technical specifications regarding delicious. Using a small amount of JavaScript these bookmarked resources can be used in Subject Guides. By using Web 2.0 social bookmarking sites, libraries can more easily manage subject guides and other lists of Web resources. Social bookmarking services

such as Delicious provide a one-click method to bookmark a Web site, allowing librarians to describe and categorize websites. Using a small amount of JavaScript, these bookmarked resources can be dynamically included in subject guides and other Web-based library resources. This paper describes and analyses the use of social bookmarking at a medium-sized, comprehensive college library for the creation and maintenance of modern languages subject guides.

"Free and open source options for creating database driven Subject Guides" by Corrado, E. M. And Fredrick, K. A. (2008) reviews available cost effective options for libraries for creating maintaining pathfinders. The paper discusses various available options such as Subject Plus, Libdata, Research Guide and Library course builder, wikis, social tagging sites like delicious along with strengths and weakness. Database-driven guides, because of their nature and design offer additional benefits as well. Their design typically enforces a standard look-and-feel for the guides. Likewise, a resource can be updated in one place and that change will appear throughout the system. This makes maintenance of these guides less time-consuming and more accurate than a traditional static HTML Webpage. While all the guides reviewed offer benefits, when investigating these guides the authors were impressed with the ongoing development of Subjects Plus and they found it straightforward and easy to maintain. If a library has a need for a more full-featured solution, they may want to look into a system like MyLibrary that is more than a subject guide portal and offers a full-fledged digital library framework. This is not to say the other solutions reviewed don't have technical merits, but the lack of recent updates may cause some concern for libraries without programmers on staff.

"WordPress as a content management system for library website: How to create a dynamically generated Subject Guide" by Dodson, J. (2008) as the title indicates explains a method of generating dynamic Subject Guides through Word Press. This paper includes technical information about Word Press along with its basic technical requirements. This article explains a method of generating dynamic subject guides through the Word Press content management system. This method includes the use of the Exec-PHP Word Press plugin and additional PHP code to create a new category-based loop within the pre-existing Word Press loop. Example code and screenshots are provided.

A study related to preparation of subject guides can be reflected in the article prepared by Erb, R. A. (2015), "An investigation into the use of LibGuides for electronic resources, troubleshooting in academic" The author explains that it is not an easy task for librarians to prepare a subject guide with the help of LibGuides. It is designed to help libraries to develop dynamic subject guides. It provides access to all the collections relevant to a specific subject area.

2.5 Role of Subject Librarian

In the article "Leading roles for reference Librarians in Institutional Repositories: One Library's experience" has been explained by Philips, H., Carr, R. and Janis Teal, J. (2005). The leading role includes a willingness to be a change agent of reference librarians. Reference librarians are strategically placed to promote and administer institutional repository initiatives successfully. The professional challenge rests in reference librarians' readiness to become scholarly publishing change agents. Most often, academic libraries are the scholarly publishing leaders on campus and must forge new initiatives while working with limited budgets and personnel. As with any new initiative, it has taken time and experimentation to define organizational best practices. Reference librarians must be comfortable with accepting leading roles in institutional repository development. The leading role requires a willingness to be a change agent and to continually assess changing roles and service impacts.

Rockman, I. F (2005) describes the role of reference Librarians in the development, management; dissemination of Institutional Repositories in the article "Distinct and expanded roles for reference Librarians". The author emphasizes traditional roles of librarian and also the qualities for populating new forms of digital publishing to capture and maintain campus base intellectual assets. Reference librarians are natural partners to be involved with IRs. Their service orientation, subject experience as knowledge managers and communication skills easily come into play as they serve as advocates for Institutional Repositories. They interact with campus creators of new digital content, whether in the form of text, numeric, graphic, aural, or visual media. In addition, their knowledge and experience with interface design, policy development, and instructional techniques all contribute to the important role they play as a campus decides to develop an Institutional Repository.

Melchionda, M. G. (2007) in her article, 'Librarians in the age of the internet: Their attitudes and roles: A literature review" provides a review of role of librarian. This review tells us the impact of the internet on the working life of a librarian. The paper also includes definition of Tammoro to specify the changing needs of users and their expectations from the librarian community. The literature review found evidence of contrasting attitudes on the part of librarians towards imposing networked and digital technologies in the information landscape. In the internet age librarians need to come to terms with a working environment that is always more dematerialized, and with their users' new information habits. It is apparent that they should be able to find a correct balance between traditional roles and new roles in order to let their professional category survive and continue to be a crucial and vital part in the information society.

Cassner, M. And Adams, K. E. (2008) in their article, "The subject specialist Librarian's role in providing distance learning services." have explained the additional role of subject Librarian to provide resources and services to distance students. Survey results found that over half of the subject librarians reported webpage updating as a responsibility for providing services to distant learners, they used specific web pages, learning modules, print handouts, online FAQs and subject guides as an instructional tool. Subject specialist librarians play a role in providing resources and services to distance students. The authors surveyed subject librarian sand distance librarians, examining how and to what extent subject librarians provide service to distance learners.

A case study of University of Marryland was undertaken by Tchangalova, N. and Feigley, A. (2008) titled, "Subject Guides: Putting a new spin on an old concept". It explains the role of subject librarians with useful tools for creating Subject Guides in the electronic environment. Application of computer technologies in the libraries has changed the format and content of Subject Guides. The article gives definitions and need for Subject Guides along with challenges faced by the creators of subject guides.

Murray, T. E. (2014) wrote an article, "Applying traditional Librarianship to new roles for special librarians". The article explains the difference between Librarian and special Librarian. For surviving in the present era Librarian must possess some special skills like using Internet, digitization, Archiving, Analysis, use of competitive

intelligence and knowledge management to perform their duties and render services which are different from traditional services. The article concludes by saying that the librarian should change their personality into embedded librarian.

The article "Capturing the contribution of subject Librarians: Applying strategy maps and balanced score card to liaison work" by Corrall, S. (2015) describes the role and skills of subject librarian as a powerful change agent with the help of Brown's definition. This paper investigates the application of Kaplan and Norton's Strategic Management system of balanced score cards and strategy maps. The author concludes that strategy maps are promising tools for articulating the competencies and contributions of subject Librarians.

Summary:

This chapter focused on published literature related to Subject Guide. The literature covers various aspects of reference service and use of the Internet in libraries along with importance. The use of subject Guide will be discussed in the next chapter.

3.1 Introduction

Subject Guides are useful tools from the view of Librarian and researchers. They provide a good starting point to any research activity in a particular subject. Subject Guides in the present era are in electronic format along with the traditional print ones also. The advantage of use of is it provides a 24/7 access. Users can use electronic subject guides at their own convenient place. Subject Guides provide a platform to researchers as well as libraries. They can be incorporated in five laws of Library science by Dr. S.R. Ranganathan. They provide reader to every reading material and reading material to every reader. They also save the time of the user. Subject guides are designed to help users to locate published information in specific fields. Some guides are prepared from grants received from Council on Library Resources. Subject Guides are subject specific and not mere guides to the literature in any exhaustive sense; they are not bibliographies either. They are for beginners for those who seek instruction in gathering the fundamental literature of a field new to them in every respect. They are designed to be useful in the initial stages of library research.

3.2 Definitions of Subject Guide

As per the Library Glossary of Bostan Collage-

"Subject Guide is a list of books, databases and other resources for a specific subject. Each guide has been complied by a librarian with expertise in the Subject." This definition focuses on contents of subject guides which include lists of books, databases and other resources. While preparing a subject guide librarians have to take help of subject expert.

According to Retiz, J.M.(Online Dictionary for Library and Information Science), "Subject Guide is a printed or online resource that provides detailed information, instructions and advice concerning the best strategies techniques and resources for research in a subject or field of study". In this definition Reitz focused on usefulness of subject guide in the field of research and study which can be summarized as under:

- Subject guides are lists of resources created to assist students with their research needs.
- A set of resources designed to help patrons fully research and explore a topic.
- Lists of carefully selected resources that will help users begin finding the information they are looking for.

The subject guides distill and codify a body of knowledge relating to the location and retrieval of information in a given subject area or discipline for a defined set of users and/collection (s). (Wales, 2004)

As defined by Canfield and Gardner (1973) a subject guide is a kind of map of all the holdings of a library specially designed for exploration of a subject. They have defined the subject guide as "Kind of Map to the resources of the library. It is an information locator for the library user whose search for recorded material on a subject of interest is just a beginning."

3.3 Difference between Subject Guide & LibGuide:

The scope of Subject Guide is confined to a specific subject taken in hand. It also covers other related subjects. While a library guide is a map which gives the locations of all the library holdings of a particular library. Its scope is not restricted to a specific subject.

3.4 Importance and need of Subject Guide

Most academic librarians have created Subject Guides in both forms (Print and Electronic). The web based Subject Guides are more popular today. They include databases, websites, journals and other sources in a particular subject. As we all know Subject Guide provides a starting place for research, Subject Guide gives an exact direction to research and helps researcher to design their research strategy.

Subject Guide helps librarians in planning and building the library collection and can also be used for inter library loan. In the modern times while preparing a Subject Guide the subject librarian takes help from IT department and Subject experts for preparing electronic Subject Guides. Subject guides help library staff to share essential information and technology skills with students. It helps them to guide and promote reading books. Subject Guide displays a variety of resources, allowing users to see the range of sources available. The main purpose of the Subject Guide is to guide student down a useful path. Subject Guides provide a list of reference resources collectively along with a small description and keywords. It helps in saving the time of the researcher. Above all points describe the importance and need of Subject Guide. Lastly, we can say that it is useful for both the parties-Librarian and library users. For the librarian it is a new approach to reference service and information literacy programme.

3.5 Purpose of Subject Guide

The Subject guides are prepared by the librarian with a particular purpose in mind. The purpose for which a Subject guide is prepared can be summarized as under:

- Providing a starting point for searching the information.
- Subject Guides offer assistance in identifying information sources.
- Subject Guides provide access points to scholarly resources.
- Subject Guides provide help as a starting point for any research activity in a specific discipline.
- Gather all most useful, relevant, reliable and authoritative resources on a particular subject.

3.6 Guidelines for Creating Subject Guides

Creating guidelines must be kept in mind while creating Subject Guides. Few guidelines have been given by Moses, D. And Richard, J. (2008)

- The first thing one may consider for a successful implementation of subject guides is the creation of a standard template. This not only allows the guides to be of a high quality with fairly consistent content but it also permits quick implementation. One librarian may take responsibility for creating the template in consultation with all members of the Library. The standard template should be created with all the possible elements that should appear in every guide. It is important to agree on which key areas to standardize and what areas can be left to the individual subject librarian.
- Reeb and Gibbons (2004) recommend using relevant labeling and easy access points to subject guides to ensure that students can find and use them. It would be good to ask students what they think of the headings used in the guides. There is a need to ensure that the phrases used are meaningful to the users and to limit the amount of jargon used. The intention is to use the usage data of the guides and also the feedback from users to further align the guides to the needs of the users.
- By providing a clear description of the purpose of guides and how they can be used may help to increase usage of the subject guides.
- Subject guides should fit the students' mental model of finding information. Reeb and Gibbons (2004) recommend creating guides for specific courses, which would give students a more direct and immediately recognizable access point to a relevant guide. Guides who are based on specific topics or courses may appeal to students more than a broad or discipline-based guide. Another approach may be to work with student focus groups to learn the types of sources, organization, labeling, and other factors that students would find useful in a guide, then build guides to fit this "mental model". This would be a long-term and labor-intensive process, but would result in guides that would prove more useful to students.
- The faculties should collaborate with librarians when building the subject guides. Thus, they will be able to share what they have discovered while

- building their own guides. It is also helpful to look at the content built by other institutions using Subject Plus.
- It is important to build the subject guides in consultation with experts in the fields. Thus, it is important for Librarians to liaising with academics with regards to the specific resources that they may want included in the subject guides, course guides or topic guides. In order to determine which subjects to cover within a guide it is also important to consult academic departments as well as soliciting patron input.
- The topic and purpose of the subject guide should be clearly identified. In the beginning paragraph the specialized terms should be explained so that users will know when researching a topic and identify key authorities in the field.
- The users are not as familiar with the resources as the librarian it is beneficial to include starting points and explain how the resource is formatted (i.e. dictionary, collection of articles, divided by geographic area, etc.).
- The library website should be designed so as to guide the students directly to the subject guides. Libraries that highlight or link directly to subject guides from their main page get many more hits on their guides than those that are difficult to find or accessed directly through subject guides website.
- The promotion of the guides is important to increase awareness that there is such a resource available to the students. Librarians promote the guides when they interact with the students during Information Literacy training classes and also when the students make inquiries at the reference desk or via email. In order to increase discoverability, the research guides should be catalogued so that they can be found when users search the library catalogue.
- It is important to make the subject guides specific to a particular library. Nothing is more frustrating than a guide that promises resources not subscribed to by the library. If the web resources are included the librarian must be sure that Library users are able to access full text articles so that they can get the complete information.

3.7 Key attributes of a subject guide

While preparing a Subject Guide few key attributes can be considered as pointed by Ndhlovu, P. (2011)

- Ease of use
- Ease of creation and maintenance
- Course-specific
- Shown and used in Information Literacy (IL) session
- Linked at courseware site
- Recommended by the course's instructor
- Design and feature consistency with library's other research guides
- Good library home page real estate
- Interactivity / "human face" via embedded chat

3.8 Role of Subject Guides with Components

Ka-Neng AU from Rutgers University Libraries says (2008) Subject Guides place a significant role mainly in four areas like instruction, Collection development, Reference and Public relations. Subject Guide is a tool of instruction and guidance for non subject specialists. It is useful for highlighting of resources from throughout the library system. It is also a new way to maintain public relations via student orientation and academic departments.

- Subject guides enable Subject Librarians to fulfill their responsibilities more effectively.
- Librarians can create guides which become valuable tools for all internet users. In the process, they can also expand their own library collections by providing access to networked information which would have otherwise been inaccessible to their users.
- Carefully constructed subject guides can help learners' access quality information more efficiently.
- Subject guides can be a vital point of contact for collaboration and cultivating partnerships for learning.
- Increases librarians control and autonomy over their web content and the ability to communicate with their community.


3.9 Components of Subject Guides (Ndhlovu, P. 2011)

Subject Guides include reference materials, Journals, databases and internet resources, etc. Many guides emphasize only on electronic resources while others include all print and electronic sources. When preparing Subject Guides, it is important to consider the components to be incorporated. As explained by Ndhlovu, P. (2011) these components may include-

- Templates: Usually there is a uniform layout or template for Subject Guides.
 The librarian is required to follow a template to create consistency among Subject Guides.
- **Images:** Photographs, Screenshots, graphics give an attractive look to Subject Guides and provide additional information to users.
- Catalogue: Catalogues give information to users about library collection. It
 can also form a part of Subject Guide whether it is in print or electronic
 format.
- **Reference sources:** Subject Guides includes a list of useful references and general collection books.
- Indexes/Databases: Links to Indexes and databases are useful sources in electronic Subject Guides.
- **Journals:** -This is the useful source of information on the specific subject.
- Government Documents: This is a useful source of information which is definitely worth exploring.
- Archives and special collections: Archives and special collections are rich resources used during research which give important information.
- Citing sources: It is essential that the sources which are used for a project or research work should be properly cited.
- Other Sources: This section may include video collections, audio samples etc.

Following snapshots gives detailed information about the contents of a sample Subject Guide.


Image No. 3.1 North Eastern University Library – Economic Research

- Standards For Learning
- Student Work Samples

- Subject Guides consume a great deal of a busy librarian's time and energy.


3.11 Creation of Subject Guide

3.11.1 LibGuides

LibGuides is a white-label subscription service which enables libraries to create a branded community of librarian-created subject guides or portals for their users. These subject guides, or libguides can incorporate all kinds of content, including pulling in RSS feeds, embedding videos and podcasts, pulling in del.icio.us tag clouds, uploading documents, and running user polls, etc. These guides are very widget-friendly. LibGuides creators can get their own individual profiles, which aggregate all of their guides and contact information, and they can even embed a live IM chat widget.

3.11.2 Social Bookmarking Sites

For creating Subject Guides some librarians make use of social bookmarking sites. A few of them have been listed below:

Del.icio.us:- Del.icio.us can be much more than a list of websites. A new account for each subject or topic can be created or bundled topics within one account. With a bit of imagination and skill, these tags can be used to create bundled web links for many topics on one page. As key wording (or tagging) should be second nature to any librarian, this should be a relatively easy job, and of being an immense value to teachers and students.

Blogs: - Blogs are used for both personal and professional communications. A blog is a discussion or informational site published on the World Wide Web and consisting of discrete entries typically displayed in reverse chronological order (the most recent post appears first). Until 2009 blogs were usually the work of a single individual occasionally of a small group, and often covered a single subject. More recently "multi-author blogs" (MABs) have developed, with posts written by large numbers of authors and professionally edited. MABs from newspapers, other media outlets, universities, think tanks, advocacy groups and similar institutions account for an increasing quantity of blog traffic. The rise of Twitter and other "micro blogging" systems helps integrate MABs and single-author blogs into societal new streams.

Wikis: - Farkas, M.C. (2007) mentions in her article that Subject Guides are easy to update, searchable and collaborative through wikis.. A wiki invites all users to edit any page or to create new pages within the wiki website. Wiki promotes meaningful topic associations between different pages by making page link creation almost intuitively easy and showing whether an intended target page exists or not. A wiki enables communities to write documents collaboratively, using a simple markup language and a web browser. Single pages in a wiki website is referred to as a "wiki page", while the entire collection of pages, which are usually well interconnected by hyperlinks, is "the wiki". A wiki is essentially a database for creating, browsing, and searching through information. Example Subject Guide: Library Success: A Best Practices Wiki. This wiki is a gem for teacher-librarians.

4.1 Introduction

Economics and Political Science have an important place in the development of any nation. Through the study of Economics and Political science, we can gain insight in a variety of areas including trade, monetary systems and the interplay between politics and economics. The study of politics and government has flourished the relations between persons, groups and nations.

The main importance of economics is helping society to decide on issues like the optimal allocation of limited resources. Economics helps to decide questions like what to produce, how to produce and for whom to produce. The detailed and systematic study of economics helps to avoid problems such as inflation. The importance of economics is that we can examine whether society is better off through government intervention to influence changes in the provision of certain goods. When we talk about the importance of economics, we must talk about Political science also as they are closely related. Political science teaches us about our political rights and privileges from a given form of government. The study of Political science is especially important to the success of a democracy. In short, we can say Political science deals extensively with the analysis of Political system, the theoretical and practical applications to politics and the examination of political behavior. 4.2 What Is Economics?

Economics is the study of the production and consumption of goods and the transfer of wealth to produce and obtain those goods. Economics explains how people interact within markets to get what they want or accomplish certain goals. Since economics is a driving force of human interaction, studying it often reveals why people and governments behave in particular ways.

The study of economics can describe all aspects of a country's economy, such as how a country uses its resources, how much time labourers devote to work and leisure, the outcome of investing in industries or financial products, the effect of taxes on a population and why businesses succeed or fail.

Adam Smith, known as the Father of Economics, established the first modern economic theory, called the Classical School, in 1776. Smith believed that people who acted in their own self-interest produced goods and wealth that benefited all of society. He believed that governments should not restrict or interfere in the markets because they could regulate themselves and, thereby, produce wealth at maximum efficiency. Classical theory forms the basis of capitalism and is still prominent today.

A second theory known as Marxism states that capitalism will eventually fail because factory owners and CEOs exploit labour to generate wealth for themselves. Karl Marx, theory of namesake, believed that such exploitation leads to social unrest and class conflict. To ensure social and economic stability, he insisted that the labourers should own and control the means of production. While Marxism has been widely rejected in capitalistic societies, its description of capitalism's flaws remains relevant. The Keynesian School, describes how governments can act within capitalistic economies to promote economic stability. It calls for reduced taxes and increased government spending when the economy becomes stagnant and increased taxes and reduced spending when the economy becomes overly active. This theory strongly influences U.S. economic policy today. Through economics, people and countries become wealthy because buying and selling are activities vital to survival and success, studying economics can help one understand human thought and behavior.

4.3 What Is Political Science?

The great Greek philosopher Aristotle called Political Science the master science. According to the American Political Science Association, "Political Science is the study of governments, public policies and political processes, systems and political behaviour". As political scientist, Lasswell, H. (1936) has explained Politics as the process of determining who gets what, when they get it, and how they get it. This is why Aristotle viewed Political Science as the master science - because politics affect pretty much every other human social endeavour. Political science helps us to understand politics. If you can understand something, you have a better chance of making it work in the manner you want. In other words, you have a better chance of helping to determine who gets what, when they get it and how they get it.

4.4 History of Economics

As observed in Wikipedia economics is the social science that seeks to describe the factors which determine the production distribution and consumption of goods and services. Political economy was the earlier name for the subject, but economists in the late 19th century suggested "economics" as a shorter term for "economic science" to establish itself as a separate discipline outside of Political Science and other Social Sciences. Besides the traditional concern in production, distribution and consumption

in an economy, economic analysis may be applied throughout society, as in business, finance, health care and government. Economic analyses may also be applied to such diverse subjects as crime, education, the family, law, politics, religion, social institutions, war, science and the environment.

Macro Economics may be defined as that branch of economic analysis which studies the behavior of all the units combined together. The following are the fields covered by macroeconomics--

- Theory of Income, Output and Employment with its two constituents, namely, the theory of consumption function, the theory of investment function and the theory of business cycles or economic fluctuations.
- Theory of Prices with its constituents of the theories of inflation, deflation and reflection.
- Theory of Economic Growth dealing with the long-run growth of income, output and employment.
- Macro Theory of Distribution dealing with the relative shares of wages and profits in the total national income.

The study of macroeconomics is indispensable as it is the main agent for formulation and successful execution of government economic policies. It is also indispensable for the formulation of microeconomic models. Microeconomics may be defined as that branch of economic analysis, which studies the economic behavior of the individual unit, maybe a person, a particular household, or a particular firm. It is a study of one particular unit rather than all the units combined together. In microeconomics, we study the various units of the economy, how they function and how they reach their equilibrium. An important tool used in that of microeconomics is that of Marginal Analysis. In fact, it is an indispensable tool used in microeconomics. Some of the important laws and principles of microeconomics have been derived directly from marginal analysis. The following are the fields covered by microeconomics

- Theory of Product pricing with its two constituents, namely, the theory of consumer behavior and the theory of production and costs.
- Theory of Factor pricing.
- Theory of Economic Welfare.
- Definition of Micro Economics

Microeconomics is the branch of economics that concentrates on the behavior and performance of individual units, i.e. consumers, family, industry, firms where demand plays a key role in determining the quantity and the price of a product in the economy along with the price and quantity of related goods (complementary goods) and substitute products so as to make decisions regarding the best allocation of scarce resources concerning their alternative uses.

Definition of Macro Economics

Macroeconomics is the branch of economics that concentrates on the behavior and performance of aggregate variables and mainly focuses on the issues which affects the whole economy. It includes regional, national and international economies and covers the major areas of the economy like unemployment, poverty, stabilizing the general price level, GDP (Gross Domestic Product), imports and exports, economic growth, globalization, monetary/ fiscal policy etc. It helps in resolving the various problems of

the economy so that it will function efficiently. The difference given by Surbhi, S. (2014) can be seen below:

From the review and analysis of different publications published and case studies on Subject Guide and synonymous terms used researcher noticed importance of Subject Guide, Library Guide and Web resource Guide as well as essentiality of developing Subject Guides. From the observation made the researcher has derived findings which are listed below.

6.1 Findings

- 1. Subject Guides first used during 1970's and replaced the earlier used term Pathfinder by MIT Librarians in which they prepared list of resources and references pertaining to Subject and Subject related resources. But today ICT is being used and pathfinders Subject Guides are termed as Electronic Subject Guides.
- 2. Subject Guides are termed differently but often used interchangeably with Pathfinders, research guides, Libguides, electronic library guides and bibliographies.
- 3. Subject Guides generally covers broad Subject including related subject and resources available for conducting deep study for users. Subject guides contains resources available in print as well as digital forms and useful for providing resources for conducting interdiciplinary research and study.
- 4. The main function of the Subject Guide is to support research scholars, learners, teachers and make them aware of qualitative resources may be available in local library are elsewhere. The Subject Guides are now required to control the information explotions. Since information explosion is very high it is difficult for users to identify right sources of information for their study purpose.
- 5. Subject Guides are generaly compiled by Subject Librarians, Subject experts, Bibliographers, Computer experts and thus it is a colabrative work. Every expertise

has a role in preparing Subject Guide viz. Librarians collect standard resources, evaluate them and include them Subject Guide whereas Subject experts evaluate content of the resources judge for its quality for uses and Computer experts suggests in developing Web based Subject Resource Guide with providing different links to Subject Resources available in different forms which includes print and digital resources.

- 6. Subject Guides are generally available and developed in advance countries like USA, UK, but very rarely these are available in developing countries. Subject guides are useful to reference librarian meeting the need of additional reading on subject to students and Faculty.
- 7. Subject Guides differ from Institute to Institute and subject groups as well as Library to Library. However the main purpose of Subject Guide is to provide starting point for Researcher using qualitative Subject Guide as well as advancing towards higher research concepts.
- 8. Subject Guides in traditional scenario covers printed resources which contains general reference sources demographic data, different specialise literature in the subject area or libraries in particular.
- 9. Subject Guides in advance era called as electronic Subject Guides, Electronic resource guide, webliographics which contain links to online resources, internet resources as well as print resources and helps user in getting research tips cytation style guides and other relevant information on subject & related subject area.
- 10. Yang(2009) pointed out and explained that in 1990 Subject Guides were popularly known as web links highlighting subject based library resources but now it is observed that it provides all resources including print and digital resources.
- 11. Subject Guides generally lists out resources or bibliographics and a well developed guide includes information about type of sources, Subject thesaurus and basic purpose is to help users which includes students, Faculty, Researchers and Librarians.
- 12. The Subject Guide is treated as best tool for getting resources to researchers and Subject for conducting standard research and updating the knowledge.

- 13. There is no set guidelines, rules, standards for creating Subject Guides. But only covers some common characterics about contents.
- 14. It can also be concluded that the users need information sources on subjects using some Subject Guides having simple to consult, clarity and depending source for information.
- 15. Expert in economic Dr. Rajesh Parchure of Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (GIPE) in his interview have stressed the importance of library resources in research. According to him the researchers mainly depend upon library resources in both forms (Print and Digital). Sometimes researchers take help through inter library loan, tie up with foreign Universities, Internet (Search engines) for getting these resources for their reference. Subject guide proves a helpful platform for researchers. Dr. Anurag Asava of Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (GIPE) also supports these views. In the views of Dr. Asava's view subject guide is a tool who saves the researchers' time.

6.2 Suggestions

- 1. There is a need to develop Subject Guide which has to be informative to all by providing annotations and relavance to subject and ranking of resources for used.
- 2. The developers as well as Librarian have to get feedback to the users regarding the utility of Subject Guide and suggestions to improve the quality of resources, structure and add if required.
- 3. Involve all users, subject experts, computer experts and Library staff while developing Subject Guide for institute which can prove as a standard source for guiding literature to the needy users.
- 4. Subject Guide developer now use ICT for developing Web portal, Library Portal and link different literature sources to share resources among all users.
- 5. Contents of Subject Guide have to be regorously checked evaluated to make the subject guide qualitative as well as quantitative. Subject Guide must cover maximum information sources in all forms and formats including print and digital covering primary to tertiary information resources and also internet resources available either free or charged.

- 6. While developing Subject Guides involvment of subject experts must be taken to add annotations for each resource which increases the use and accessibility of resources.
- 7. Subject Guides developed by each institute for every subject is to be loaded on intranet as well as provide web access to get more information resources to researcher.
- 8. While developing Subject guide the use of ICT techniques must be made to add quality and value addition provide URL links in Subject Guides with annotations.
- 9. Design of Subject Guide may be simple but clear and it must provide access to all types of literature with citations to different similar sites.
- 10. To avoid confusion in consulting Subject Guides the developer or creator has to define exact scope of the subject generally from broad to narrow and related subjects.
- 11. Subject Guides once developed is not the end point but developer and creator has to regularly update it to cover new resources for currency.
- 12. Librarians have to arrange orientation courses or programmes for the users and highlight the importance of Subject Guides for its effective use and promoting use of literature either available in the Library or in the subject available at various places.
- 13. Subject Guides are most useful for reference Librarians and the responsibility of developing creating and evaluating resources before adding to Subject Guide is prime importance.
- 14. Subject Guide developer must analyse different Subject Guides available for different subjects on the net and review them for developing good Subject Guide using framework for Subject Guide and add contents to it.
- 15. New tools like wiki's, databases, open source Subject Guide softwares to be used for modernisation and universal use of data covered in it.

6.3 Scope for Future Reesrach

There have been very few research studies and user-centred research studies conducted in the field of subject guides. The research study conducted on subject guides in developing countries has been conducted but there is a need to conduct more similar studies in the developing countries. Similar studies of preparing a subject guide can be carried out in other subjects which will prove as an important source for the researchers.

6.4 Conclusion

The researcher has systematically studied the different facets of subject guides and justified the objectives selected for the study in different chapters covered in this thesis. The hypothesis selected is also proved true. Most academic librarians in developed countries have created subject guides in one form or another, whether they were printed "pathfinders" created years ago or web-based subject guides that are

more popular today. They synthesize vast amounts of information about databases, websites, journals, and other sources and list only the most relevant sources for a particular subject.

In an age of information overload, students and researchers like to have millions of potential sources at their finger- tips. Certainly, no one would expect a new student to read through an A-to-Z list of all the databases available and then decide which the best for a particular research problem is. Thus it seems almost intuitive that providing a short list of links to the most relevant data divided by subject would be an important tool for students, new researchers, or researchers venturing into the literature of an unfamiliar discipline.

However, inspite of the necessity and prevalence of subject guides, there is surprisingly little research on subject guides, particularly user-centred research. Furthermore, little research that has been done suggests that students are not using subject guides. This study benefits both LIS scholarship and practice by (a) providing new insight into how students are using subject guides, how subject guides affect information-seeking behaviour, and students' preferences for design and content; and (b) helping practitioners to create subject guides that better meet the needs of students.

This research study has achieved its goal to gain new insights for students actually how to use subject guides and into what elements of subject guides users like and dislike. It was discovered that students rarely use subject guides and used for purpose other than to find databases. However, since most students are using subject guides simply for finding the best database, these links should be emphasized for easy access with the least amount of clicks. In addition, it was found that users want clean and simple guides that are free from clutter and confiasing language. The advent of Web 2.0 has spawned a wide variety of tools and services that allow nonprogrammers to create and update Web content on their own. These tools include content management systems, blogs, wikis, and social bookmarking. Although many of these resources were not designed specifically for libraries, they can be used to develop and maintain subject guides. Some tools must be installed and run from a local server. This requires tech nical support from within the institution. Other tools are Web-based, using the software as a service (SaaS) model. Instead of buying software and pay- ing for future

upgrades, SaaS is subscription-based, and all upgrades are pro- vided during the term of the subscription.

Summary

This chapter summarizes the findings, suggestions and conclusion of the research study. The objectives set have been explained in the various chapters and the hypothesis set has been proved true. There is a need for creating good Subject Guides in developing countries in which not much work has been done in this direction as compared to the developed countries.
